

Bloomsbury Festival secures National Lottery Heritage Fund support to mark 50th anniversary of the Independence of Bangladesh with local residents

Supported through a grant of £38,000 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the Bloomsbury Festival project 'Visible People, Visible Places' will shine a light on the local Bangladeshi residents in Bloomsbury as they mark the 50th anniversary of the Independence of Bangladesh.

Participants from the local community will research Bangladeshi history and their centuries old culture and present at events and exhibitions at the Bloomsbury Festival (15-24 October 2021). Young people the community will work with digital partners to create new interpretations and responses.

The project is coordinated by Bloomsbury Festival working alongside local community associations, and with volunteers and curators, to mark the anniversary of Independence, with further exhibitions and the creation of digital content about their for the benefit of Bangladeshi people locally, the whole neighbourhood, and a much wider audience.

The project will include an outdoor photographic exhibition, a live event at the British Library, and film and sound recordings.
